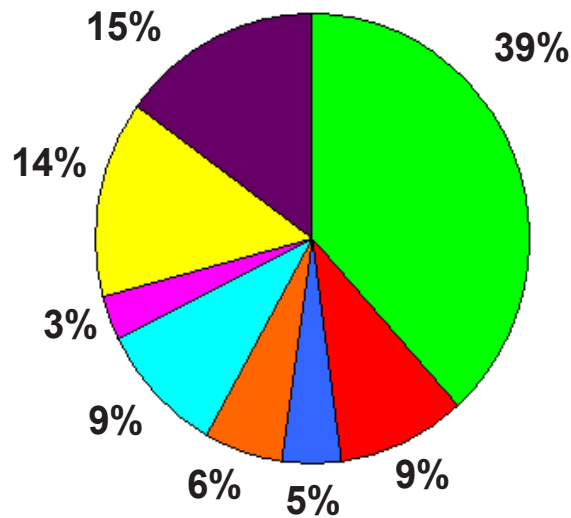

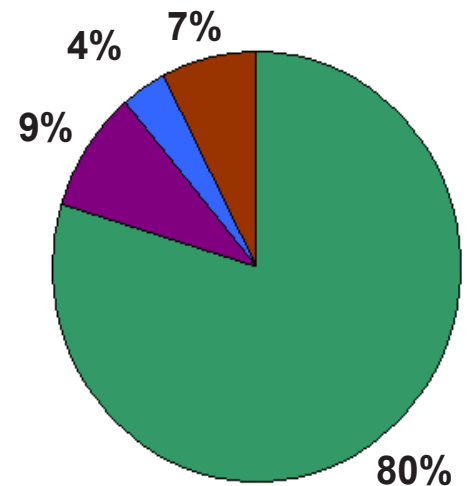

Top Major Choices

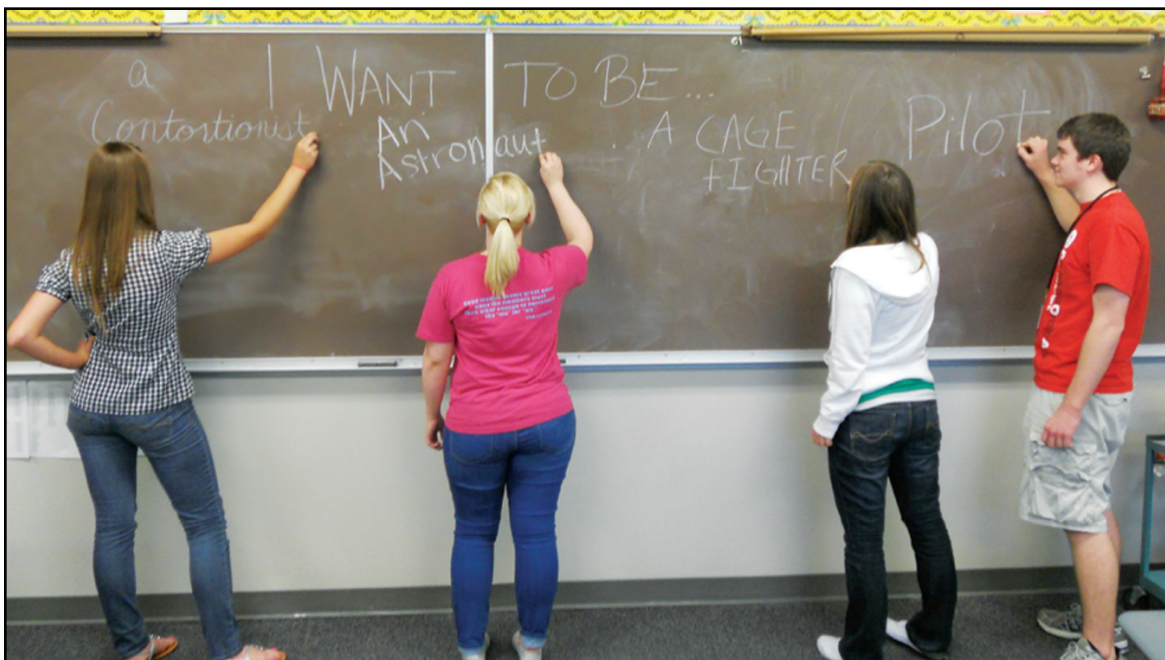
